Horse show gave way to Santa parade

During the early 1960s, the Stouffville Santa Claus parade consisted of the jolly old fellow riding in the back of a convertible from Latcham Hall to the Main/Market/Mill streets area with virtually no one lining the streets to see him, according to long-time resident lim Thomas.

That is a far cry from today's parade, which has thousands of Stouffville's young and old jammed onto the sidewalks in eager anticipation of seeing Santa.

Long before anything resembling today's parade came along Main Street, there was horse judging at the farmers' market in the 1930s and '40s at Dolly's Hall, which is now the Silver Jubilee Club, according to Mr. Thomas.

"It was quite the competition and at the same time, they brought their produce to sell," he said.

"This was the place to come buy your Christmas turkey," he said of the event held the week before Christmas.

In 1950, the annual horse show was cancelled as more emphasis was being placed on the Santa Claus parade, which started a few years earlier.

That same year, with the Stouffville Merchants Association at the helm for the parade, there were nearly a dozen floats, which included bicycles and doll buggies decorated by children.

At around this time, parade costs were about \$600 and the event attracted 2,000 to 5,000 people lining the main thoroughfare to see Santa and receive a gift bag from him.

The Chamber of Commerce took over the parade in 1954 and established the first Sunday in December as the parade date going forward — a tradition that continues today.

Later in the 1950s, the parade grew to about 20 floats and helped bring shoppers downtown.

It didn't seem to work because in 1962, downtown merchants considered curtailing it or giving it a "sharp reduction" in size.

For unknown reasons, there was no parade in 1964 and 1965.

But in 1966, current organizers — the Stouffville Kinsmen Club — resurrected it.

In a letter to the editor of The Stouffville Tribune, Kinsmen members said they wanted to provide the parade in order to foster community spirit. They didn't want money, just support.

In their first year as hosts, the Kinsmen Santa Claus parade was supported, attracting five bands, 20 floats and 30 other individual entrants. Hundreds of people lined Main Street.

"It was a good parade. We had good times," said Ross Hetherington, who was a part of the Kinsmen Club who brought the parade back to Stouffville. "It brings the kid out in you."

One parade that stands out for Mr. Hetherington took place in the early 1970s.

"It was so cold, they couldn't blow the bugles," he said, adding it was -26C.

This year's theme is Christmas movies.

Saturday's parade starts at 2 p.m. at Tenth Line and Aintree Drive. It heads north on Tenth Line then goes west along Main Street before turning south onto Weldon Road. It ends at Stouffville District Secondary School.




