Stouffville's Lindsay Burrows was named co-athlete of the week for the week ending Dec. 9 at Elmira College in Elmira, NY.

Burrows is a second-year defenceman on the school's hockey team.

Elmira is 13-1-1 overall and 0-0-0 in its conference. The school is third-ranked in Division 3 (small college) in the latest uscho.com poll.

With the game knotted at 1-1 late in the third period, Justin Bohemier delivered the game-winning marker with just under two minutes remaining in regulation time.

Leading the team in points during the tournament with nine goals and four assists, Jordan Ianuzziello had the first Stouffville marker.

Stouffville forward Thomas Tanunagara was named the game's MVP; his second nomination during the tournament as he also garnered that honour during the club's 6-0 win over the Clarington Red Bulls in the semifinal.

Stouffville posted round-robin victories over the Clarington Red Bulls 6-3 and Clarington Tornados 6-1 before battling the Clarington Thunder to a 2-2 tie.

Buoyed by the return of a number of injured players, the Clippers opened the tournament with a 7-2 victory over Etobicoke.

Mike Varsamis propelled the Clippers' offence with three goals while Davis had two, Twizell and Mike Vitelli each had singles.

Assists went to Sutherland with two, Davis, Twizell, Cranley, Batty, Hembruff and Carmine Tisi each had one.

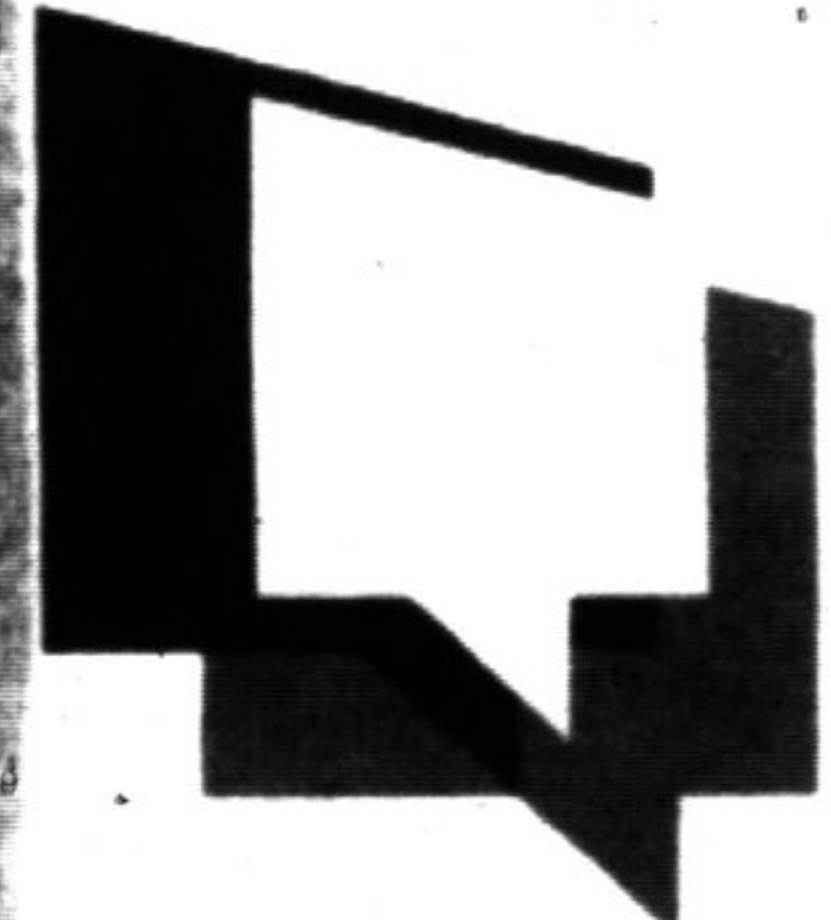
