Del Zotto signs with Rangers, gets ready for opener

Michael Del Zotto wasted little time in signing a National Hockey League contract.

The ink was barely dry on the league's new deal with its players, when the Stouffville resident signed a new contact with the New York Rangers last weekend.

"I didn't want to miss any time,"
Del Zotto told reporters. "I wanted
to be here with the team starting
at Day 1.

"With us being off for four months or whatever it is, it's greatto have everyone back right away."

The Sports Network said the two-year deal was worth \$5.1 million.

Del Zotto was a restricted free agent, coming off a career-high 10 goals and 41 points with the Rangers last season. The 22 year-old defenceman was the Rangers first-round pick in 2008.

The Rangers, who opened train-

ing camp Sunday, begin the season Saturday in Boston against the Bruins.

Del Zötto played in Switzerland

during the NHL lockout, but also worked out in York Region and with his old junior team, the Oshawa Generals.

He was also spotted helping out at a friend's grocery store in Oak Ridges.

Del Zotto started playing in the Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association while attending St. Mark Catholic School.
