Police office costing town \$560,000

Councillors question deal with York Regional Police

It is going to cost the town about \$560,000 to accommodate York Regional Police's move into the municipal office.

And that does not include free rent from when they move in later this year, to July 1, 2014.

York Regional Police have agreed to pay for all construction costs related to them taking over around 4,500 square feet of vacant and currently in-use town hall space to transform it into a sub-station housing police officers, administrative staff and an information counter for the public. There will be no detention cells.

York Regional Police's cost will be approximately \$1.15 million.

Two of the town's departments have to move elsewhere in the building, about 20 new parking spaces are required and a \$125,000 roof repair that was scheduled to be done in 2014/2015 will be completed now.

"That was a cost we were going to incur anyway," Marc Pourvahidi, the town's treasurer and director of finance, told The Sun-Tribune.

"In my view, financially, it's a great deci-
