It reduced the number of OMHA qualifiers to four per category from eight.

The rest of the teams play for York Simcoe titles.

Only the Hamilton Red Wings have a poorer record in the 22-team league.

The last place team in the North Conference hadn't tasted victory in more than a month — Jan. 4 when it beat the Stouffville Spirit 4-2.

Until Thursday, that is, and a return date with the Spirit, the team that sits one spot ahead of them in standings.

The Panthers put a large dent in the Spirit's already-iffy playoff hopes with a 5-3 win at the Stouffville Arena.

Marc Stevens, Corey Derose and Nathanael Halbert scored for the Spirit, which led 2-1 after one period and was tied 3-3 after a pair.

The Panthers celebrated the win like they had won a playoff round, whooping it up with Barrie in his crease.

The Spirit trails the Cobourg Cougars by eight points for the final playoff spot in the North-East Conference. Each team has five games remaining, including a head-to-head match-up Monday in Cobourg. The Spirit's next game is in Wellington Sunday.


