

Relay for Life re-launching Markham, Stouffville event

Relay for Life is headed back to the Markham and Stouffville area.

Proceeds from this year's event, to be held June 21 at Markham Museum, will fund cancer research and provide support and information for people living with cancer, their caregivers, family and friends.

Last year, more than 300 participants at Relay For Life for all of South York Region raised more than \$87,000.

The Markham Fairgounds and Willowgrove in Whitchurch-Stouffville have also hosted the event.

"(It's) such is a life-altering experience for many who attend and has had such a huge impact on the community," said Laura Parsons, fundraising co-ordinator for the Canadian Cancer Society's South York Region Unit.
