## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE **APRIL 2, 2013 COUNCIL MEETING**

## CONSTRUCTION/PROJECT MANAGEMENT RFP -**RENOVATION OF MUNICIPAL OFFICES AND UPDATE** FOR YORK REGIONAL POLICE (YRP) TENANCY

Town Council approved the interior renovation project for the Town's Municipal Offices to accommodate a tenancy by York Regional Police (YRP). The York Region Police Services Board approved the project and the estimated capital costs.

The new office space will accommodate police officers, administrative staff and an information counter for the public; however, there will be no detention cells. The renovations will

provide YRP with their own public entrance, service counter, telephone, communications systems and will not be using the Town's common areas in the Municipal Offices. In January 2013, Council pre-approved the capital budget of \$1,716,000. Funding for this project will be shared proportionately between the Town and York Regional Police.

The Town issued an Request For a Proposal for Construction/ Project Management (CPM) services for the project. The proposal from the successful bidder, METTKO Design Builders, provides for construction and project management services for a seven (7) month period from April to October 2013.

#### **PROGRAM FUNDING** -**REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK**

The Regional Municipality of York (Region), Community and Health Services Department, manages municipal and provincial funding initiatives with the aim of enhancing community development in York Region

In July 11, 2000, Council approved an agreement with the Regional Municipality of York to provide 100% subsidized summer recreation programs for children (3 – 12 years) of Ontario Works participants in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, under the Community Investment Strategy. The agreement has been renewed and expanded over the years and for those who qualify, now includes 100% subsidy for: summer camp (ages 6-13 years), for the PLAY (Positive Activities for Youth) program (ages 4-18 years) and 1:1 support for inclusion of those with special needs. As of 2011, the Region added funding for recreational programs for sole support parents, determined to be eligible by the Region. Since 2000, the Community Investment Strategy agreement,

has assisted children, youth and sole support parents, living in low income families by providing over 200 children and youth 100% funding towards recreational programming in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

#### FIREWORKS BY-LAW AMENDMENT

Council approved minor amendments to the Fireworks By-law, specific to the setting off of Family Fireworks. Currently, Family Fireworks are permitted to be set off on Victoria Day and Canada Day including the two days immediately proceeding or following each day except with special permission granted in writing. Authority to grant this permission for special occasion other than Victoria Day and Canada has been delegated to the Fire Chief.
