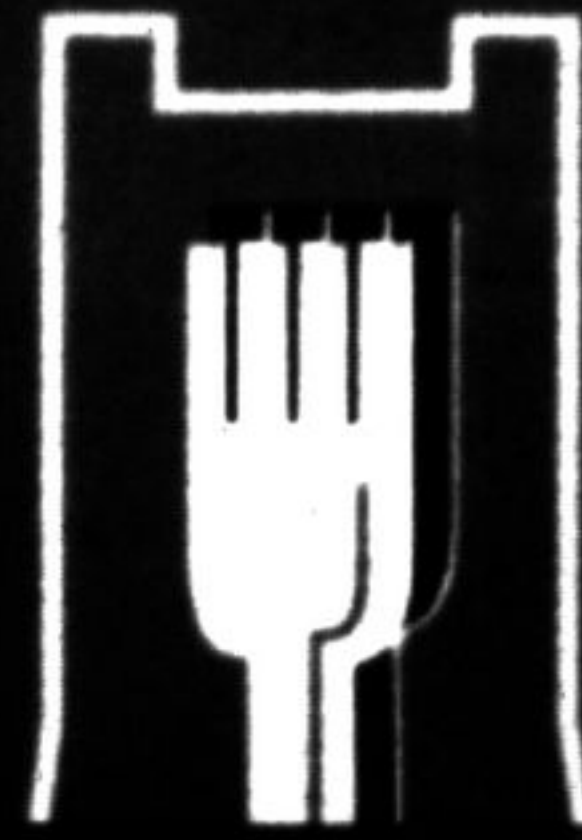

New club for intellectually disabled

An adult social club for individuals with intellectual disabilities and/or cognitive impairments is now up and running within Whitchurch-Stouffville.

The program was created in partnership with Community Living York South and is designed to maximize the independence of the participants — physically, mentally and emotionally — according to town spokesperson Maria Schembri.

It started April 14 and runs to June 9.

The adult social club is for people 50 years of age and older. Each weekly theme will incorporate functional fitness and life skills, according to Ms Schembri.

The social club meets Sundays from 1 to 3 p.m. at Latham Hall and on Thursdays from 1 to 3:30 p.m. at the Ballantrae Community Centre.

The fee is \$90 for unlimited session attendance. The drop-in fee is \$10.

Hours cut at town hall

The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville's centralized customer service centre will no longer be open after hours on the first and third Tuesdays of the month come June.

The staff recommendation was approved by council last week.

During the customer service centre's first 18 months of operation, it remained open until 8 p.m. twice a month to measure public interest. People took advantage of the additional hours, however, "... volumes and the staff required to offer this service do not warrant its continuation at this time", according to the council report.

Throughout 2012, customer contacts via e-mail increased while drop box/mail processing decreased, according to the report.

The town hall will remain open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Friday.

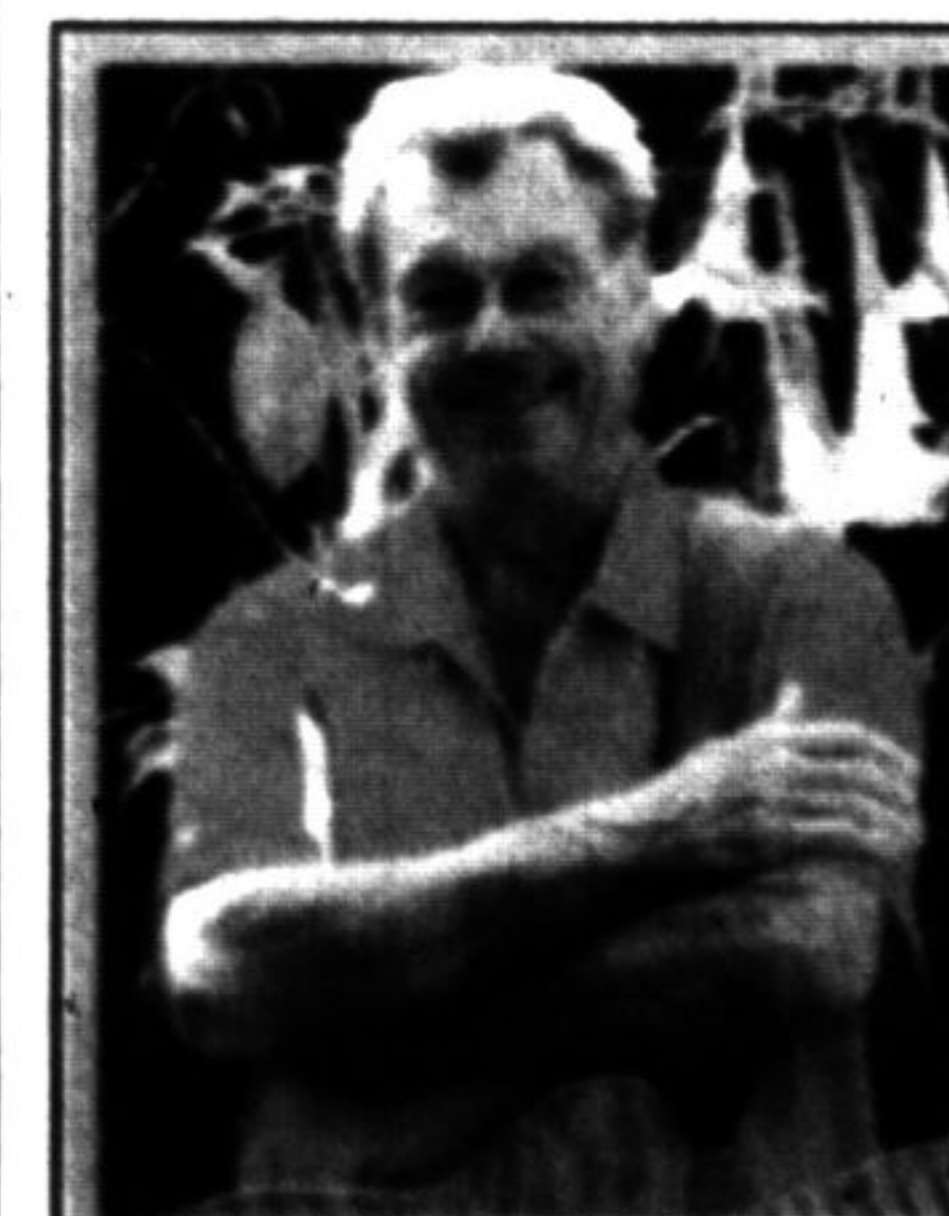
