### Shred documents at safety village

You can play a role in shredding identity theft. We are all guilty of discarding junk mail, such as a pre-approved credit card application, we receive in the mail.

But what you may not realize is you're leaving a wealth of information and temptation for criminals in your trash, York Region Crime Stoppers police co-ordinator Sgt. Trevor Hanko said. Criminals are filling out these applications and putting a different address on them, which means they can secure a credit card in your name, he said.

"It only takes a little more information than what's available in the phone book."

Sgt. Hanko shreds everything with any hint of personal information on it, including ripping off magazine covers and shredding them before recycling the rest.

For those who have boxes of old files in the basement or stacks of papers needing to be destroyed, Crime Stoppers and Cintas Document Management have teamed up to help you with your spring cleaning.

"Ripping documents in half just isn't enough to protect yourself," he said.

For \$10 a bag or \$15 a banker box, you can hand over your documents and have them shredded in front of you. Events are Saturday at the Community Safety Village of York Region, 3291 Stouffville Rd., 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., in conjunction with its open house and May 18 at Upper Canada Mall, 17600 Yonge St., 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.




