Check out museum, new wedding exhibition on free Saturday

Admission to the Whitchurch-Stouffville Museum is free this Saturday.

That is because it is International Museums Day, which raises the awareness of the role museums play in the development of society.

The first museums day was held in 1977.

Visitors will be able to see the Bogarttown Schoolhouse, which was built in 1857 and believed to be the oldest brick schoolhouse still standing in southern Ontario, outside Toronto.

There is also the Vandorf Public School, which served as the local OPP headquarters from 1957 to 1971. It was built in 1870.

Staff will be installing the museum's newest exhibition — With This Ring... A Heritage Wedding Album — which runs from June 1 to Aug 31.

The museum, 14732 Woodbine Ave., will be open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.
