## Learn how to tame your energy bill

Learn which upgrades to your home can impact your hydro bill or how energy conservation can increase the re-sale value of your home.

Those are just two of the upcoming webinars being presented by the Whitchurch-Stouffville Community Energy Co-operative.

The monthly webinars are part of the group's Kill the Kilowatt Challenge: Working Together Toward a Sustainable Stouffville.

New participants receive a personal training session on the webinar software prior to the first one June 6, entitled Who are the Energy Hogs in Your House. It will help you read your time-of-use data to track the culprits.

On July 4, the topic is new technology to heat and cool your home, which includes finding out how upgrades effect your hydro bill.

Energy conservation and the re-sale value of your home is the Aug. 8 topic, which is followed by information on investments in renewable energy to reduce future utility costs (Sept. 5).

All webinars begin at 8 p.m.

### Kenyon returns to court in fall

Paul Kenyon will return to a Newmarket court to face second-degree murder charges this fall. His pre-trial resumes Oct. 16.

The case was put over last week.

A mistrial was declared in the case back in April 2012 when Mr. Kenyon parted ways with his lawyer, Ken Murray.

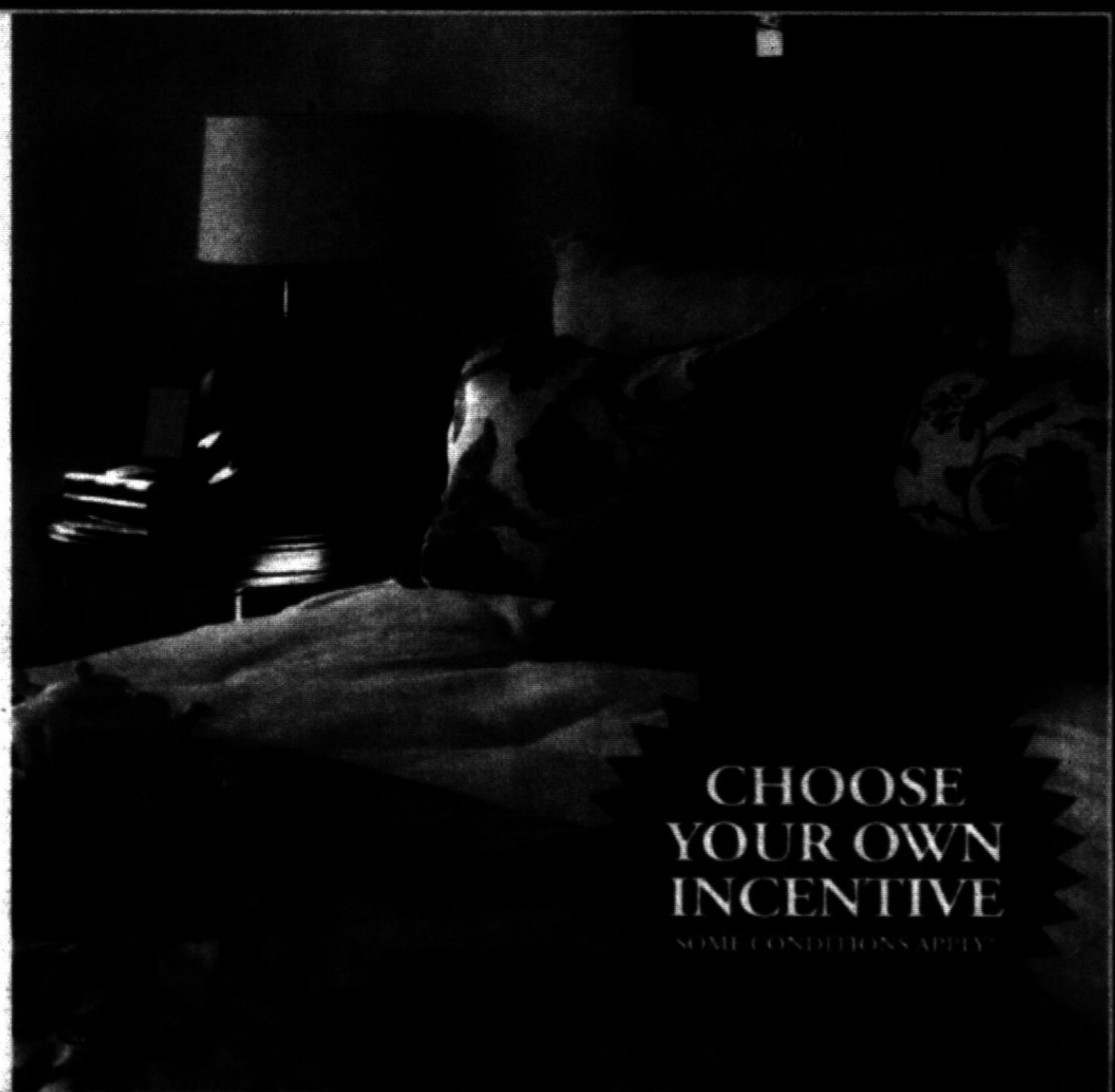
Mr. Kenyon, who is accused of second degree murder in the death of his then-girlfriend Marion Deacon, then hired Newmarket's

Leo A. Kinahan. Mr. Kinahan has since left the case.

Around 8 a.m. March 7, 2010, York Regional Police and the Whitchurch-Stouffville Fire and Emergency Services were called to a fire at the Deacon home at 6 Doner St. in Gormley.

Mr. Kenyon was found outside the residence and conscious. He was transported to a hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Firefighters found Ms Deacon inside with no vital signs. The post-mortem exam revealed she died of blunt-force injuries to the head.
