NOTICE OF RENAMING HIGHWAY 7

Between Highway 50 and Donald Cousens Parkway City of Vaughan, Town of Richmond Hill and City of Markham

The Regional Municipality of York is proposing the renaming of Highway 7 to 'International Drive' between Highway 50 and Donald Cousens Parkway. 

"I just think we're really lucky to have it. The more people support it, the better," Mrs. Alles said of the public gallery.


