The Regional Municipality of York NOTICE OF RENAMING HIGHWAY 7 Between Highway 50 and Donald Cousens Parkway City of Vaughan, Town of Richmond Hill and City of Markham

The Regional Municipality of York is **proposing the renaming of Highway 7** to 'International Drive' between Highway 50 and Donald Cousens Parkway. The renaming of Highway 7 to International Drive reflects the ethno-cultural diversity and richness that characterizes the communities this roadway passes through in the City of Vaughan, Town of Richmond Hill and City of Markham.

The name change will reinforce the new vision for the corridor of being an urban main street within York Region. In addition to the number of existing businesses and residential units along the corridor, new developments continue to grow along Highway 7. Due to this fact, and to minimize the impact and costs, it is being proposed that the name change happen during the same time as the opening of the new VivaNext rapidway.

A report proposing the name 'International Drive' replacing Highway 7 is scheduled to be presented to the Transportation Services Committee:

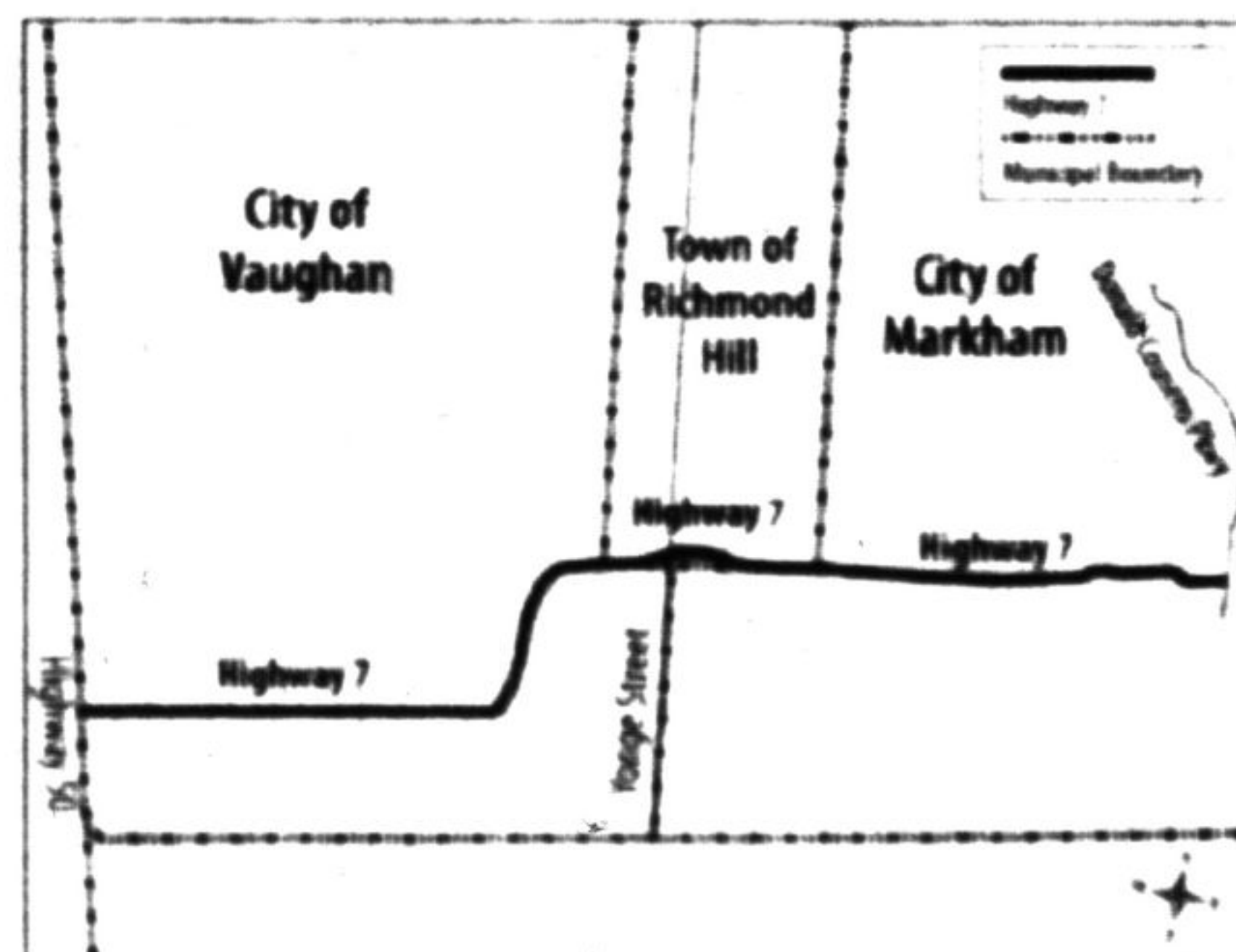
