The cost is \$30 per person and 100 per cent of the proceeds will be split between the Special Olympics and Tayah Fairbrother.

#### Legion gives Parkview seniors a lift


Parkview Home has a new mechanical lift thanks to the Stouffville Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion.
