When Danny Shields entered Stouffville District Secondary School as a Grade 9 student last year he heard a lot about the reputation of the Spartans' rugby program and wanted to be a part of it.

To make the team, Shields attended the initial tryouts over the Canada Day weekend.


During those auditions, Shields entered it with an open mind since it represented the first time he was involved in such a process with the provincial team.

While Shields was elated to make the team, Matt Macaulay, his coach while playing during the summer months with the Markham Irish Canadian Rugby Football Club, wasn't the least bit surprised.

Especially since Macaulay described Shields as a player who possesses a great passion for the game and has the ability to adapt

In explaining what success he's

had in such a short period of time while playing the game, Shields was quick to credit his Stouffville Secondary coaches, Glenn Tarver and Steve Crummey.

Not to mention the great rugby tradition built at his high school.

"Stouffville District Secondary School has a good rugby program and great coaches like Mr. Tarver and Mr. Crummey who have helped me a along the way," he said.

While elated to be a part of the provincial team and at SDSS, Shields hasn't looked too far down the road as to how far he wants to take his career on the pitch.

For now, he just wants to continue to build on the foundation he's laid as a player.

"Right now, I just want to keep playing the game," he said.

While Shields was chosen to be a part of the travelling provincial team, one of his Stouffville District Secondary School and Markham Irish Canadian Rugby Football Club teammates in Haydn Messner, made the under-15 provincial squad's 40-member long list before the final travel roster was chosen.
