

Race team chases down win on owner's birthday

The Stouffville-based EHR Team Three Red race car owner and former Stouffville Spirit Jr. A hockey club owner was presented with a checkered flag.

Jason Hathaway drove the Snap-on Tools/Rockstar Energy Drink Dodge to victory at the NASCAR Canadian Tire North Wilson Equipment 300 race at the Riverside Speedway in Antigonish, N.S.

It was the team's first win of the season.

After a good practice session and qualifying seventh on the one-third mile oval for the 300-lap event, Hathaway raced his way to the fifth spot by lap 69.

With a caution brought out on lap 87, EHR Team Three Red crew chief Craig Masters called Hathaway in for fuel.

That move paid off as Hathaway worked his way back up through the field and was in third place by lap 143.

When a car in front of him made a late race pit stop, Hathaway moved into second.

Restarting on the outside of the front row on lap 288, Hathaway moved down in behind the leader and worked the inside line off the second turn and took the lead coming out of corner four to win the race.

"This team works so hard each and every week in the shop and at the track," Hathaway said. "We have been so close to winning a race this year and it feels awesome to finally get the win."

The next scheduled race for Hathaway will be the Clarington 200 on the road course at Canadian Tire Motorsports Park near Bowmanville Sept. 1.

The race will be part of the NASCAR Camping World Truck Series.
