Concussions send hockey player back to track

Third serious injury has Barker pursuing throwing scholarship

Greg Barker grew up playing and loving hockey.

But when the Stouffville resident was instructed by his doctor last fall to quit playing the game after incurring his third major concussion, he promptly hung up his skates.

While the ominous news was disheartening for the 17-year-old Barker, it did not spell the end of his athletic exploits.

Rather, he's attempting to carve his niche in another sport involving far less physical contact.

At the same time it's one he's been fairly adept at — throwing the discus and shot put.

He apprenticed in both disciplines during his first three years at Stouffville District Secondary School, winning a bronze in discus and finishing fourth in shot put as a Grade 9 student and placing fourth in both events as a Grade 10 student at the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations championships.

Barker is now training full time with the York University Track and Field Club.

"It was definitely a tough decision to quit hockey since I played it most of my life," Barker said. "But hockey isn't the end of the world. I had something to fall back on. I'm now focusing on track."

Working under the direction of coach Jack Harkness, a former Canadian discus champion, and being symptom free, Barker has experienced some modest success.

In early August, he qualified to compete at the National Youth Track and Field Championships in Langley, B.C.

Making his debut at that meet, Barker recorded a personal best 15.17 metres in the shot put and finished fourth out of 19 entrants.

In the discus, he was fifth with a toss of 46.35m amongst a field of 16 entrants.

"I really didn't know what to expect at the meet because it was my first year with the York University club," Barker said. "But I was

definitely happy with the results. Especially the shot put because I struggled with it during the summer.

"With the discus I was happy. In the last month I improved some four to five metres. I definitely feel like I'm progressing in both events."

Undergoing a different training routine to where he's now placing an emphasis on strength work as compared with cardiovascular drills during his hockey days, Barker has also been forced to make an adjustment in his new sport.

The biggest one has been the use of heavier implements.

At the recent National Youth meet, Barker threw a discus weighing 1.6 kilograms versus one that was just one kg. in high school events.

With the shot put he also threw a heavier ball.

"To go with heavier implements is definitely a challenge," he said. "Your throwing techniques now become different. You have to move

your body in different ways."

Entering Grade 12 this academic year, Barker has some unfinished business to do before graduating.

The biggest aim is to get back to the OFSAA championships, something he failed to do last year.

He would like nothing more than to have a grand send-off to his high school career by winning the gold in shot put and discus.

"My goal is to definitely medal at OFSAA," he said.

At the same time, Barker intends to continue workouts with his York University club in preparation for the indoor season and to go to the Junior Nationals next summer.

With some good results, Bark'er hopes to parlay that towards his post secondary school days in earning an athletic scholarship at a university south of the border.

Above all though, Barker just wants to continue to get better and remain free of any concussions.

"My goal is to continue to progress," he said.
