Gajan Sivabalasingham will be part of a select group to be recognized Sept. 30.

The 19-year-old Ballantrae resident will be among 201 student athletes from the University of Waterloo to be honoured for their work not just on the athletic playing field, but in the classroom as well.

Entering his third year as a member of the school's men's golf team, the math and business major earned a spot on the school's honour roll after maintaining an average of 80 per cent and higher while competing in an inter-university sport.
