# Town quiet on sudden exit of CAO

Councillors are remaining pretty tight-lipped about the sudden retirement of Whitchurch-Stouffville's CAO.

"Is the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville a better place because of Dave Cash – I'm sure it is," Councillor Richard Bartley told The Sun-Tribune.

The Sun-Tribune reached out to all councillors, but only Mr. Bartley would comment. All other councillors would not comment or did not return our e-mails and phone calls.

Mr. Cash's salary was \$187,671 in 2012.

Mayor Wayne Emmerson told The Sun-Tribune via e-mail: "I want to ensure all residents of Whitchurch-Stouffville that it is business as usual. We have appointed an acting CAO, Andrew McNeely. I believe all directors and their staff will continue to provide the best level of service for our residents."

Councillor Richard Bartley on sudden retirement of CAO

Mr. McNeely has been with the municipality since 1999 and the town's director of planning and building services since 2008.

The municipality sent out a media release around 4:15 p.m. Wednesday stating Mr. Cash has retired. He was not at the Tuesday night council meeting.

He was the town's CAO since 2006.

"I have enjoyed my time with Whitchurch-Stouffville, serving the community and working with the great staff at the town," Mr. Cash said in the media release. "I would like to wish everyone continued success in the future."

The Sun-Tribune has reached out to Mr. Cash through the municipality for an interview. He did not respond by our publication deadline yesterday.

Prior to his post in Stouffville, Mr. Cash was a commissioner for the Town of Oakville.
