

# York hairstylists helping in fight against cancer

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Talking to a hairdresser is far cheaper than a psychiatrist and we walk out of the appointment with a fabulous haircut.

The Central Regional Cancer Program at Southlake Regional Health Centre is counting on that hairdresser/client relationship to foster a discussion on cancer screening dur-

ing its Stylists Save Lives campaign, which runs during National Cervical Cancer Week, which wraps up today.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness month.

The program is based on the Be a Breast Friend project, which ran in the Hamilton and Niagara areas to raise awareness about the importance of routine breast screening for women aged 50 and older, according to Alisha Somji, junior health

promoter for the Regional Cancer Screening Program. Southlake Regional Health Centre.

Stylists Save Lives focuses on breast, cervical and colon cancer screening.

"These are the three cancers that have provincial organized screening programs based on sufficient evidence showing that the benefits of the screening outweigh the potential harms," Ms Somji told The Sun-Tri-

bune in an e-mail.

Fame Salon and Spa on Main Street is one of 16 York Region, North York and South Simcoe participants.

"Just to have awareness is half the battle," said Carmen Pastore, manager of Fame Salon and Spa.

Many clients treat going to the salon as a therapy session because they are comfortable talking about very personal issues. That could be because 85 per cent of stylists are

women and many clients go to the same stylist, therefore, it provides a comfortable atmosphere for discussing cancer screening, according to Ms Somji.

On Oct. 31, the Ladies of Southlake will be at the Stouffville salon from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. handing out key chains, containing a ball about the size of a cyst to show women what they should look for in self-examinations.

On September 18, 2013, Enbridge Gas Distribution Inc. filed an application with the Ontario Energy Board (the "Board") under the *Municipal Franchises Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. M55, for an order renewing Enbridge's right to operate works and add to works for the distribution of gas in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville for a period of 20 years and for an order declaring and directing that the assent of the municipal electors is not necessary.

Enbridge also applied for an order canceling the existing certificates of public convenience and necessity for certain geographical areas now incorporated within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville and replacing them with a single certificate of public convenience and necessity for the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville. The application has been assigned Board file numbers EB-2013-0336 (regarding the request for a franchise agreement) and EB-2013-0337 (regarding the request for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity).

The application will be decided by the Manager, Natural Gas Applications, who has been delegated this authority pursuant to section 6 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act*, 1998, S.O. 1998, c.15 (Schedule B). The Manager, Natural Gas Applications, does not intend to provide for an award of costs when deciding the application.

#### How to see the Application

To see a copy of the application, go to the Consumer page of the Board's website and enter the case number **EB-2013-0336** and/or **EB-2013-0337** in the "Find an Application" box. A copy can also be seen at the Board's office and at Enbridge's office at the address below.

The Board intends to proceed with the application by way of a written hearing unless a party satisfies the Board that there is a good reason for not holding a written hearing. If you object to the Board holding a written hearing in this matter, you must provide written reasons why an oral hearing is necessary. Any submissions objecting to a written hearing must be received by the Board within **10 days** of the publication date of this Notice.

#### How to Participate

##### Comment

If you wish to give your opinion on the proceeding you are invited to send a written letter of comment to the Board no later than **30 days** after the publication or service date of this notice. A complete copy of your letter of comment, including your name, contact information, and the content of the letter, will be provided to the applicant and the Board. All letters of comment will be placed on the public record, which means that the letters can be seen at the Board's offices and will be available on the Board's website. Before placing the letter of comment on the public record, the Board will remove any personal (i.e., not business) contact information from the letter of comment (i.e., the address, fax number, phone number, and e-mail address of the individual). However, the name of the individual and the content of the letter of comment will become part of the public record. Please address your letter of comment to the Board Secretary at the address below, and reference file numbers **EB-2013-0336** and/or **EB-2013-0337** at the top of your letter.

##### Observe

If you do not wish to actively participate in the proceeding but you do wish to receive documents issued by the Board, you may request observer status. Your written request must be received by the Board no later than **10 days** from the publication or

service date of this notice. All letters requesting observer status will become part of the public record, which means that the letters can be seen at the Board's offices and will be placed on the Board's website. Before placing the request for observer status on the public record, the Board will remove any personal (i.e., not business) contact information from the request (i.e., the address, fax number, phone number, and e-mail address of an individual). However, the name of the individual and the content of the request for observer status will become part of the public record.

##### Intervene

If you wish to actively participate in the proceeding (e.g. submit questions, file argument), you may request intervenor status from the Board, no later than **10 days** after the publication or service date of this notice. Instructions for requesting intervenor status are available on the Board's website at [www.ontarioenergyboard.ca/participate](http://www.ontarioenergyboard.ca/participate). Everything an intervenor files with the Board, including the intervenor's name and contact information, will be placed on the public record, which can be seen at the Board's offices and on the Board's website.
