



Kinsmen hope Santa's parade grows with town

Are you on the naughty or nice list this year?

Santa will make a preliminary visit to check out residents' claims of being good or bad Dec. 7 as he anchors the annual Stouffville Kinsmen Santa Claus Parade.

For people interested in participating in the parade, this year's theme is a storybook Christmas.

"It's a general theme and hopefully everyone gets into it and we get interesting floats that way," said Aaron Marshall, a Kinsman and this year's parade chairperson.

Classic tales that can be transformed into floats include A Christmas Carol, How the Grinch Stole Christmas, The Night Before Christmas and A Charlie Brown Christmas.

Last year's parade included about 50 floats, according to Mr. Marshall.

"Hopefully, we can get over 50 floats, more community involvement, especially with the way Stouffville is expanding," he said.

Last year's parade theme was Christmas movies. Some of its winners included Stouffville Academy of Music and Dance (most humorous), Budget Towing (most original) and Stouffville Towing (best theme).

This year's parade starts at 2 p.m. at Tenth Line and Aintree Drive. It heads south to Main Street, then west along Main Street and south onto Weldon Road. It ends at Stouffville District Secondary School.

Viewing the entire parade will take about two hours, according to Mr. Marshall.

"Hopefully we can keep up the tradition of putting on a good and well organized parade," he said.

The cost to enter a float into the parade is \$50 for businesses. It is free for schools and not-for-profit organizations.
