Kwok flying as Ryerson athlete of week

Vivian Kwok has made her presence felt on the badminton court as a member of the Ryerson University Rams women's badminton team.

The Stouffville resident, who is in her second year at the Toronto school, was named its Female Athlete of the Week for the period ending Nov. 17 after capturing a women's singles tournament hosted by Ryerson last weekend.

Kwok won all four of her matches in the tournament, losing just one set.

Last year, Kwok was the school's women's team most valuable player and an Ontario University Athletics all-star.

Wise make points for hockey Rams

With the Ryerson University Rams men's hockey team returning to action this past weekend after forfeiting their last two Ontario University Athletics games, forward Jamie Wise did not appear to exhibit any rust.

Wise scored a goal and added one assist in his club's 9-5 win over the visiting Carleton University Ravens Saturday.

The 22-year-old Stouffville resident, who is in his second season, has four goals and 11 assists

in nine games for the Rams, who returned from their suspension with a 7-1 win over visiting RMC Friday.

With the two victories, the Rams were 7-4 in OUA action and 10-9 overall.

The Rams were expected to have their head coach and Stouffville resident Graham Wise - Jamie's father - back behind the bench Monday after he served a four-game suspension handed down by the university after the team violated a student-athlete conduct pact during an October trip to Princeton University in New Jersey.

John Duco, who played briefly for the Jr. A Stouffville Spirit in 2004, coached the Rams during Wise's absence. Duco joined the Rams staff this season after coaching in minor and junior hockey.

Peewee Stars shine in Lake Placid

The Stouffville-Markham peewee BB Stars skated off with the gold medal from the Can/Am Challenge Cup tournament that was capped off with a 2-0 win over the Leaside Wildcats in the recent final in Lake Placid, N.Y.

Hailey Craven and Chloe Freeze each scored once for the Stars, who broke open a scoreless first period with a goal in the second and one

in the third to ice the game. Samantha Wong stopped every shot directed at her to record the shutout.

The Stars opened the tournament on a positive note with a 6-1 win over the Connecticut Ice Cats. Jillian Hutton delivered a pair of goals while Alana Ivens, Madison Ribi, Freeze and Craven each added singles.

Facing the Saranac Red Storm in their second game, the Stars were buoyed by a pair of goals from Ribi in a 5-1 win.

Amanda Morelli, Taylor Burton and Craven each chipped in with single tallies.

The Stars' lone blemish in the tournament was a 4-1 loss to Leaside.

Craven accounted for the lone Stars' tally.

In a rematch with the Connecticut Ice Cats, the Stars were paced by a hat trick from Craven and two goals from Morelli in a 7-1 win. Lisa Matthews and Ivens rounded out the scoring.

With the win, the Stars faced Leaside in a rematch for the gold medal.
