### Stouffville man, 64, jailed in major child porn bust

Iwo York Region residents have been caught up in one of Canada's largest commercial child pornography rings.

Hennessy, 64, of Terence Whitchurch-Stouffville, was arrested by York Regional Police in January 2012 and has since been convicted of possession of child pornography.

He received a three-month jail sentence.

Brandon Donnelly, 29, of Aurora,

is charged with working for Azov-Films.com, the GTA website Toronto police believe was selling and distributing child pornography films.

The men are just two of 348 citizens, including 108 Canadians, charged in Project Spade – a probe that stretched from Canada to Germany to Australia and South Africa.

The force's investigation found that videos of boys, ranging in age from five to 13, were shot in Romania and then edited and packaged in a Toronto warehouse before being

sent to customers around the world. The films involved boys in various scenes of undress involving nude wrestling, oil massaging, mimicking sexual acts and touching of genitalia, according to police.

The images of some of the youngsters filmed in these sessions eventually ended up in the home of Mr. Hennessy after he purchased them for between \$30 and \$50, according to Det.-Const. Jaafar, from York Regional Police's Internet exploitation (ICE) unit.

In all, Mr. Hennessy had 28 videos classified as child pornography, 10 of them labelled as less graphic involving child nudity.

"They were graphic," said Det.-Const. Jaafar. "Totally naked, some sexual acts, some rolling around on the bed without sex acts. We don't agree with comments like he was just viewing these videos, because every time he views it the child is victimized again."

On top of videos, the Stouffville resident was in possession of thousands of images from all over the world, the detective added.

"I was horrified at the quantity he" had," she said.


Mr. Hennessy is prohibited from visiting any place children under the age of 16 may be, including parks, schools and libraries for the next 20 years, Det.-Const. Jaafar said.

Mr. Donnelly is charged with possessing and making child pornography. He has pleaded not guilty.

He will next be in court Dec. 2 and his trial starts Jan. 13.
