CIS grad helping SDSS hockey girls make jump this year \{\g\}

When Brian Shankman elected to ice his Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans varsity girls' hockey team in the highly competitive York Region Athletic Association tier one circuit this year, some players questioned his sanity.

After all, it's been four or five years since the Spartans last competed in tier one.

This season though, the Spartans veteran head coach felt the timing was right to make the bold move in facing the likes of perennial powerhouses of Bill Crothers and Aurora.

While one game doesn't constitute an entire season, the Spartans' 2-2 tie against Aurora in their regular season opener at the Clippers Sports Complex last Thursday might provide a ray of hope.

Especially after they overcame a 2-0 deficit through one period before getting goals from Emily Wood, on a slapshot from the point, and Abbie Bauman along with timely saves by Paton Melvin.

"Maybe we were a little jittery in the first period, but we seemed to get better in the second and third period," Shankman said. "And we were forced to kill off three minors in the game. I was pleased."

Last season, when after playing just two games in tier two before the provincial public school teachers' labour situation arose and shut down the remainder of their schedule, they were 2-0.

Shankman saw the potential. There's also depth, including three solid forward lines.

"The last time we were in tier one we got pounded and didn't win

a game. But that was because we didn't have players," he said. "Last season. I had a team with about four or five strong Grade 9 players at that time and now that they're in Grade 10, I had a good feeling we would be a better team."

PROMISING START

"We sure won't improve by playing weaker opponents. The tier one game is a lot faster and to play higher calibre teams they will improve. If we get beat, so we get beat. But it's good for the girls to improve and to have fun."

Shankman also accentuated the positives to his team of playing tier one by noting it's the only route to take if they have aspirations on possibly competing at the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations playdowns.

Another factor that spurred

Shankman into making the jump to tier one took place off the ice with the presence of some assistance he's receiving on the bench this year.

With Christina Davis new to the school teaching staff and team, Shankman noted she played the game at the collegiate level while attending St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, N.S.

"She has brought in some new ideas for our team and I'm taking a back seat during practices.

"She's been a great help and she's someone with a hockey perspective that I haven't had working with me in a few years," Shankman

With six teams in the YRAA tier one and the top four making the playoffs, Shankman said their club's goal is to be one of the select teams to qualify for the postseason.

For this to happen, Shankman hopes his senior Grade 12 players in team captain and defenceman Laura Monk along with forwards Mackenzie Harrington and Ellen Brown will provide the leadership required on and off the ice.

So far, he said, they've been doing the job.

"There's a lot of enthusiasm with this team and the girls are coachable. I'm happy with this team. They have a lot of heart and they're quick.

"I'm quietly confident we will improve and get better as the season goes on. Right now we're going in the right direction," Shankman

After a road game against St. Maximilian Kolbe (Aurora) yesterday, the two teams will have a rematch at the Clippers Complex Monday at 3 p.m.


