Whitchurch-Stouffville's Emmanuel International Canada has embarked on a three-phase disaster plan for the Philippines, which consists of emergency relief, rebuilding and rehabilitation in three cities — Tacloban, Guiuan and Ormoc.

Typhoon Haiyan affected more than 10 million people Nov. 8.

The relief effort will include providing emergency food supplies, clean drinking water, medical supplies, tarps/tents, blankets, sleeping mats and hygiene kits.

The second phase will consist of rebuilding, which includes cleaning debris, providing home repair kits and water containers, as well as drilling wells.

Rehabilitation will be the third part of the

plan, which includes providing skills training and introducing micro finance opportunities.
