After being imprisoned for 27 years by the former government of South Africa, Mr. Mandela emerged and continued his dedication to the peaceful end of apartheid in South Africa.

In 1991, Mr. Mandela became the first black president of South Africa to be elected in a democratic society. He held that office until 1997. He went onto serve as the secretary general of the non-aligned movement from 1998 to 1999.

Mr. Mandela received more than 250 honours, including the Order of Canada, the 1993 Nobel Peace Prize and the United States Presidential Medal of Freedom. Mr. Mandela was also recognized by the Government of Canada and Parliament as Canada's first honorary citizen.

Mr. Mandela's commitment to South Africa and his unwavering belief in fairness, equity and justice for all is a lasting legacy. He has been recognized as a hero, leader and true inspiration with a legacy that will be honoured by many generations to come, according to the town's media release.
