Hockey players assist Sun-Trib's Santa Fund

There's still time to play Santa this Christmas, Whitchurch-Stouffville.

For close to a decade, the Stouffville Sun-Tribune has supported area families through its Santa Fund. Each year, the goal is the same: to bring warmth and good will.

(The association, which includes 950 boys and girls, is also filling a hockey net with food donations for the Whitchurch-Stouffville Food Bank.)

"People don't realize that while we live and work in an affluent area, there are many in our community on hard times," Mr. Duncan said. "A small gift might not be able to 'save' anyone. But everyone deserves a Merry Christmas."

The Santa Fund efforts go toward supporting families in Yellow Brick at every stage of their experience from entering a shelter to participating in an outreach program.


While gift cards for clothing, food and gas are always at the top of the list, the program tries to get items on a family's wish list.

"This is the holidays," said Yellow Brick House resource development coordinator Amber Gordon-Bunn. "Teens don't ask for socks and underwear. Teens want skateboards and hoodies. They just want to be like their friends."

Yellow Brick House also hosts Days of Giving near the holiday season, where moms can come into the centre and pick out gifts that were donated through the Santa Fund.

"Moms leave in tears," Ms Gordon-Bunn said. "These gifts show the community cares."
