Stouffville player strikes gold

Cory Tanaka struck the Motherlode, Saturday.

The 25-year-old Stouffville resident collected one assist in helping Canada

win the gold medal at the 2013 Winter Universiade with a 6-2 win over Kazakhstan in the championship final in Canazei, Italy.

A fourth year student at St. Mary's University in Halifax, who also served as an assistant captain for Canada, Tanaka's helper came on a goal by Unionville resident Matthew Maione in the first period that put Canada ahead 3-1.

The gold medal won by the Canadian men's team was their fourth in Winter Universiade competition.

Prior to enrolling at St. Mary's University, Tanaka played in the Ontario Hockey League with the Plymouth Whalers and Belleville Bulls.

Coho program in Credit swimming along

Some new residents took up occupancy at the Ringwood Fish Hatchery recently.

To be precise, 140,000 coho salmon eggs found a new home.

The eggs were collected on a volunteer basis by 20 members of the Metro East Anglers Association and Ministry of Natural Resources personnel at the Credit River.

Bruce Burt, a Metro East Anglers Association spokesman, said the 140,000 coho salmon eggs collected fulfilled the quota they were allowed under a directive from the ministry as a part of their salmon stocking program in the Great Lakes.

From there, association members will volunteer their time to rear the eggs until fry stage at the Ringwood facility.

"All of the eggs are resting comfortably in their incubation trays," said Burt.

In collecting the eggs, he noted it was a day-long process with association members collecting the eggs and transporting them back to Ringwood.

Burt noted they encountered little difficulty, as there were plenty of mature coho salmon present in the Credit River.

"The numbers of coho in the Credit are growing, so our efforts (in rearing them) are paying off," he said.

To make room for the new inhabitants as they grow, Burt said the coho salmon they collected a year ago as eggs and raised at the Ringwood facility to a size of 27 grams, were stocked in the Credit River in late October where they are expected to migrate toward Lake Ontario to grow to a mature stage before returning to the Credit River to fulfill their fall spawning duties.

Some 50,000 fry were released, he said.

With signs the coho program in the Credit River is a success, the association is hoping in the future the ministry may allow for expansion of it eastwards into the Rouge River.


