Despite coming up short after winning the York Simcoe title with this collective group in the last two seasons, Allan was pleased with the effort his club gave during the season.

Especially since he noted his club lost four players from last year's squad who moved up to the AAA level.

"There weren't too many people who thought we would get to this point (the OMHA final). But the kids worked hard all year."
