### OVERVIEW OF NINETEEN ON THE PARK'S 2013-2014 BUDGET

Board Chair, Harry French, presented Council with a Status Report on activity and programs from 2013 and also the business plan for 2014. The Board based upon continued success in terms of attracting both local and professional cultural events, has indicated the desire to continue making improvements and usage for the Facility by promoting additional rentals.

### DOWNTOWN STOUFFVILLE: RECOMMENDED 2014 COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PLAN PROGRAMS

In 2009, Council adopted a Community Improvement Plan to assist in the redevelopment and enhancement of private properties within the Downtown Core Area. On an annual basis as part of the Budget deliberations, Council determines whether they wish to fund the Community Improvement Plan.

For 2014, Council allocated \$50,000 to fund approved projects under this Plan.

Council approved incentives to foster investment and redevelopment of buildings, signage and facades up to a maximum loan value of \$15,000

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE OFFICAL PLAN - GROWTH MANAGEMENT STRATEGY IMPLEMENTATION AND PHASE 3 LANDS - TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE

Council adopted a Staff Report on the Growth Management Strategy Implementation & Phase 3 Lands Fiscal Impact Analysis and the Phase 3 Lands Transportation Analysis, Sanitary and Water Systems Review, and Conceptual Stormwater Management Plan. The Phase 3 lands expand the urban boundary of the Community of Stouffville and respond to the growth projections assigned to the Town by the Region. The adoption of these Reports by Council establishes the blueprint of how the future growth in the Phase 3 area will occur.

### 2014 FIRST QUARTER CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE REPORT

Council received for information purposes an update on the current status of the delivery of the 2014 capital infrastructure projects currently underway by the Town. These various projects are designed to enhance infrastructure to support the growth occurring across the Town, or alternatively, to replace and rehabilitate existing services that occurs through normal life cycle replacements.




