SDSS rugby girls tackle title

Stouffville District Secondary School's Spartans senior girls' rugby team ruled the pitch at the Humber Cup High School Tournament after winning the title that was capped off with a 5-0 victory over Cardinal Newman (Scarborough) in Friday's championship match.

Storm Cerrelli scored the lone try in the match.

In reaching the final of the 14-team event, the Spartans did not

surrender any tries after defeating St. Mary's Catholic Secondary School (Toronto) 15-0 on the strength of two tries from Cerrelli and one from Abbie Bauman.

Buoyed by tries from Anna Horner and Cerrelli, the Spartans won their second match over Heart Lake (Brampton) 10-0.

With a berth in the final on the line, the Spartans received tries from Bauman, Cerrelli, Anika Belmont and Kaylene Thompson-Bruce in a 20-0 win over Applewood Heights (Mississauga).

The Spartans juniors lost their first game to Applewood Heights 10-5 with Vanessa Mainella scoring the lone try for Stouffville.

After a 10-0 loss to White Oaks in their second match, the Spartans fell 10-5 to Sacred Heart.

Hayley Patterson recorded the lone try for the Spartans.

The Spartans bantam boys' rugby team did not win a match at the Streetsville Tigers Invitational Tournament Friday.

But in accentuating the positive,

they received a good education on the sport after taking on three teams with elite programs.

In the junior boys' triple jump, Ivan Zhou was fourth.

In the girls' field, Amanda Romano was third in the senior girls' discus.

Another third-place result came from Juliana Hutton in the open girls' 1,500m steeplechase.

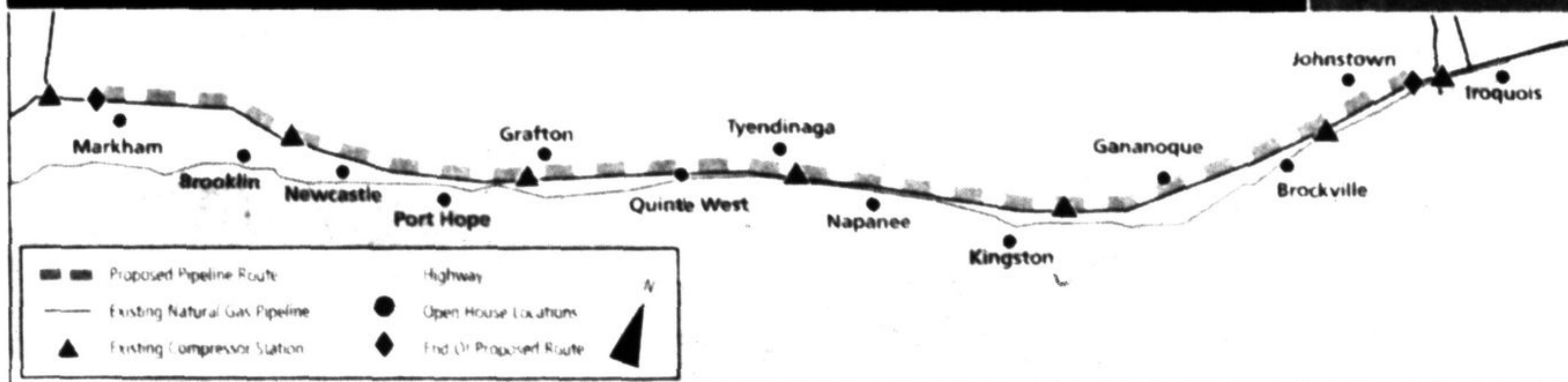
Alycia Holt ran her way to a fourth-place finish in the junior girls' 1,500m.

The Proposed Project

TransCanada is proposing to construct new natural gas pipeline facilities primarily along our existing pipeline corridor between the City of Markham and the community of Iroquois located in the Township of South Dundas. Route deviations away from the existing pipeline corridor are being considered in some locations due to:

- environmental features
- adjacent land uses
- construction constraints
- stakeholder feedback

The project is proposed to include up to approximately 370 kilometres of 36 inch diameter pipeline as well as new compressor units at five existing compressor stations located in the Municipality of Clarington, the Township of Alnwick-Haldimand, the Township of Tyendinaga, the City of Kingston and the Township of Augusta.

TransCanada anticipates filing an application with the regulator, the National Energy Board (NEB) in Q3, 2014.
