"Time does fly. I can't believe it. ... It's so much fun I don't even realize the time flying by," said Anna Rose, Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville's downtown co-ordinator who spearheads the weekly screenings.

In its 2011 pilot summer, average attendance was 150 people. Last year, the films drew an average of 500 people each time, Rose said.

"Proof is in the pudding — the community really liked it," she said.

The key to bringing so many people out is movie selection, Rose said, noting she chooses films a family with young children would enjoy as much as a senior or teenager.

When Rose started the outdoor movie nights, her goal was to bring all demographics of Whitchurch-Stouffville together and to the downtown to see what it had to offer.

"It's gone beyond what I expected," she said.

"It's a social destination. It reminds me of why people come and live in Stouffville — the camaraderie of it. You just feel like singing kumbaya," she said.

Popcorn and drinks are available for purchase at the movie site, but "people are more than welcome to come early and have a picnic" and bring their own movie snacks, Rose said.

A chair, blanket and bug spray are good things to bring.


