

## What is E-waste?

Electronic waste (e-waste) is any electronic equipment in your home that no longer works and cannot be repaired. E-waste should not be thrown in the garbage as these items contain materials that have recyclable parts or hazardous materials that should be disposed of properly.

## Examples of e-waste include:

- · Cell phones, telephones, pagers, fax machines
- · Computer towers, laptops, modems, keyboards and mouse
- Cameras

- · Monitors, printers, scanners and typewriters
- · Televisions (limit of 2 per visit)
- · VCRs, DVD players, radios, stereos and speakers

E-waste may be brought to any York Region Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Depot or Community Environmental Centre. Disassembled electronics will not be accepted. Some retailers also accept electronics to be recycled.
