Living in ward important to Ward 4 hopeful

Outgoing Mayor Wayne Emmerson predicted there would be 50 candidates running in October's municipal election.

He may not be that far off. With a few weeks left to register, there are to date 22 registered candidates - five for mayor and six for the seat in Ward 4.

Rick Upton is one of them.

"We're hoping to get a few more to get a baseball team," the 64-year-old first time council candidate joked.

Upton is not concerned by the number of candidates voters will be able to choose from because "when I review all these candidates, I don't view all of them are serious about being a councillor and that's unfortunate".

The Ward 4 resident said his address works in his favour.

"If you don't live in the ward, how can you understand what's happening in the ward? That's vitally important," he said.

The business owner also differentiates himself from the five

other candidates - Rene de Vries, Holly Fullager, James Liaros, Jim Priebe and Mark Witte - by the number of years he spent in the corporate world as a senior vicepresident operating an \$80 million organization.

"It's vital experience needed to be an effective councillor," he

Instead of separating out the needs and wants of his ward and those of the entire municipality, Upton believes they are "intertwined".

"You can't say I want my ward to have it, you can't have it. We have to work together. It's all one," the married father of three and stepfather to one adult child said.

Upton has no previous political experience, but he is involved in a handful of local organizations, including the Whitchurch-Stouffville Chamber of Commerce (director and vice-chairperson) and the Whitchurch-Stouffville Softball Association (coach and director).

He co-founded and is the director of the Imperial Networking Professionals Group. Upton was also one of the organizers of the Stouffville Home and Lifestyle Show earlier this year.

The grandfather of four is not on Twitter, but has a Facebook page and website. Face to face is how he wants to interact with his constituents.

"To me, it's important people

meet and know the person who will represent them in council," he said.

As the municipality grows, Upton wants to preserve its "smalltown persona". However, he said there is a need for more YRT and GO transit services, as well as affordable housing, in particular apartments and condos.

He is in favour of the library/ leisure centre expansion but noted "we're not offering the youth anything, which we have to put that in there".

Other candidates officially running for office are: Justin Altmann, Phil Bannon, Richard Bartley, Arnold Neufeldt-Fast and Willie Reodica (mayor); Ken Ferdinands (Ward 1); Maurice Smith, Adam Schickedanz (Ward 2); Hugo T. Kroon (Ward 3); Michael Humphreys, lain Lovatt and Tom Winters (Ward 5); Rob Hargrave, Joanne Iannuzzi, Susie Nadarajah and Senthuran Paramasamy (Ward 6).

The election takes place Oct.
