

Cockburn still hoping to qualify for Pan Am Games berth

Karen Cockburn played an integral role in helping Canada win the team event gold medal in women's senior trampoline at the 2014 Senior Pan American Gymnastics Championships in Mississauga Monday.

The 33-year-old Stouffville resident and three-time Olympic medallist, who is attempting a comeback after taking time off after giving birth to a daughter last year, finished third in the preliminary round after recording a score of 98.020.

Defending Olympic gold medallist Rosannagh MacLennan of King City was first with a score of 99.110, while Samantha Sendel of Aurora was second at 99.045. Samantha Smith of Kelowna, B.C. was fourth.

With Canada taking the top four spots, they were assured of having a second participant for the 2015 Pan American Games to be held in the Greater Toronto Area. As the host, Canada was already given one spot.

"That was our main goal," Cockburn said of the second spot.

In finishing third during the preliminary round, Cockburn did not advance to the medal round as the top two performers from each country advanced. MacLennan won the gold while Sendel was second.

"I almost went off the trampoline and I had to put in a simple skill to get my score up," she said of her second routine. "It would have been better than to fall off, which would have been worse."

Despite not reaching the podium in the individual event, Cockburn remained optimistic and now awaits what the procedure will be for her to try and procure a spot for next year's games. Cockburn anticipated she will know within the next month what competitions will count towards reaching her goal.

At the same time though, she acknowledged it will be a challenge with MacLennan, Sendel and Smith all capable of representing Canada.

"All four of us are good and only two will represent Canada," she said.

Squirts sink Port Perry for title

The Stouffville Storm squirts captured the North York Women's Softball League championship with a 14-4 mercy-shortened victory over Port Perry in the final last weekend.

Trailing 4-2 in the fourth inning, MacKenzie Dryburgh and Chloe Freeze each hit clutch two-out singles to score Victoria Diamond and Allie Moustakis to tie the game.

After Storm pitcher Daniela Fava struck out the side in the sixth, momentum continued in Stouffville's favour as they erupted with 10 runs to win the game by mercy.

Montana Hicks led off the inning with her third home run in the tournament.

Freeze and Fava combining to toss a no-hitter in a 9-0 victory over Kawartha Lakes.

Hicks jump-started the offence with two home runs and five RBIs. Brynne Naworynski and Victoria Diamond each had key two out hits early in the game.

The Storm then faced Port Perry and

emerged with an 18-4 win.

Port Perry jumped out to a quick lead scoring three runs in the top of the first inning before the Storm's bats came alive with 17 hits in the game.

Rebecca Woo had three hits and three RBIs while Raychel Gilles had two hits and four RBIs. Kait Achtermeier, Kiele Wong and Fava all had two hits, while lead-off hitter Amy Rustico scored three runs.

Fava picked up the win.

This put the Storm into the finals of the double elimination tournament where they faced Port Perry, who reached the final with a win over Cobourg.

The Storm are coached by Jeremy Freeze along with Tom Dryburgh, Rosalie Naworynski and Tim Boswell.

The Storm will be holding tryouts for the 2015 novice team for girls born in 2001 and 2002 in early September.

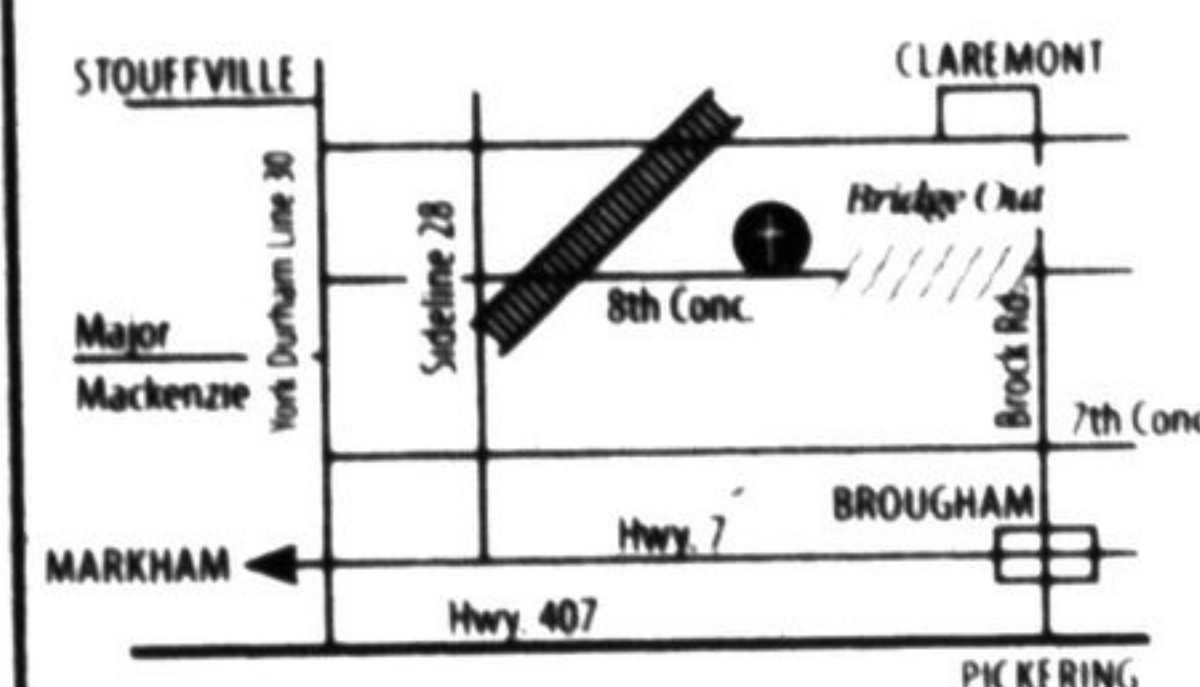
