

Victim remembered one year after crash

causing death and breaching his probation conditions.

He was also given a 10-year driving ban Aug. 15 at the Newmarket courthouse.

It was on the night of Sept. 24, 2013 when the pair crashed into a parked landscaping truck at Lori Avenue and Wheeler Crescent near Tenth Line and Hoover Park Drive in east-end Stouffville, where they were both living at the time.

The rear of the landscaping vehicle came through the Loughlin's red Chevy Cruze windshield,

injuring Gougoulis.

After the crash, Loughlin drove the car to his home, which was two minutes away, with Gougoulis still alive on the passenger side.

York police officers arrived at the home after being warned

something had gone wrong with the car by the OnStar communication system inside the car.

When they arrived, police found Gougoulis still alive in the car, however, she died soon after on scene.

Gougoulis was a mother of two boys and regularly attended Father Boseovski's church since she was a small child.

"When a young person dies, everyone is shocked. When it is this kind of event, people are even more shocked," he said. "She was a very good person... these are very sad circumstances."

The family of Gougoulis

attend the Orthodox St. Dimitrija Solunski Macedonian Church, on Main Street, in Markham, where the 39-year-old spent much of her life.

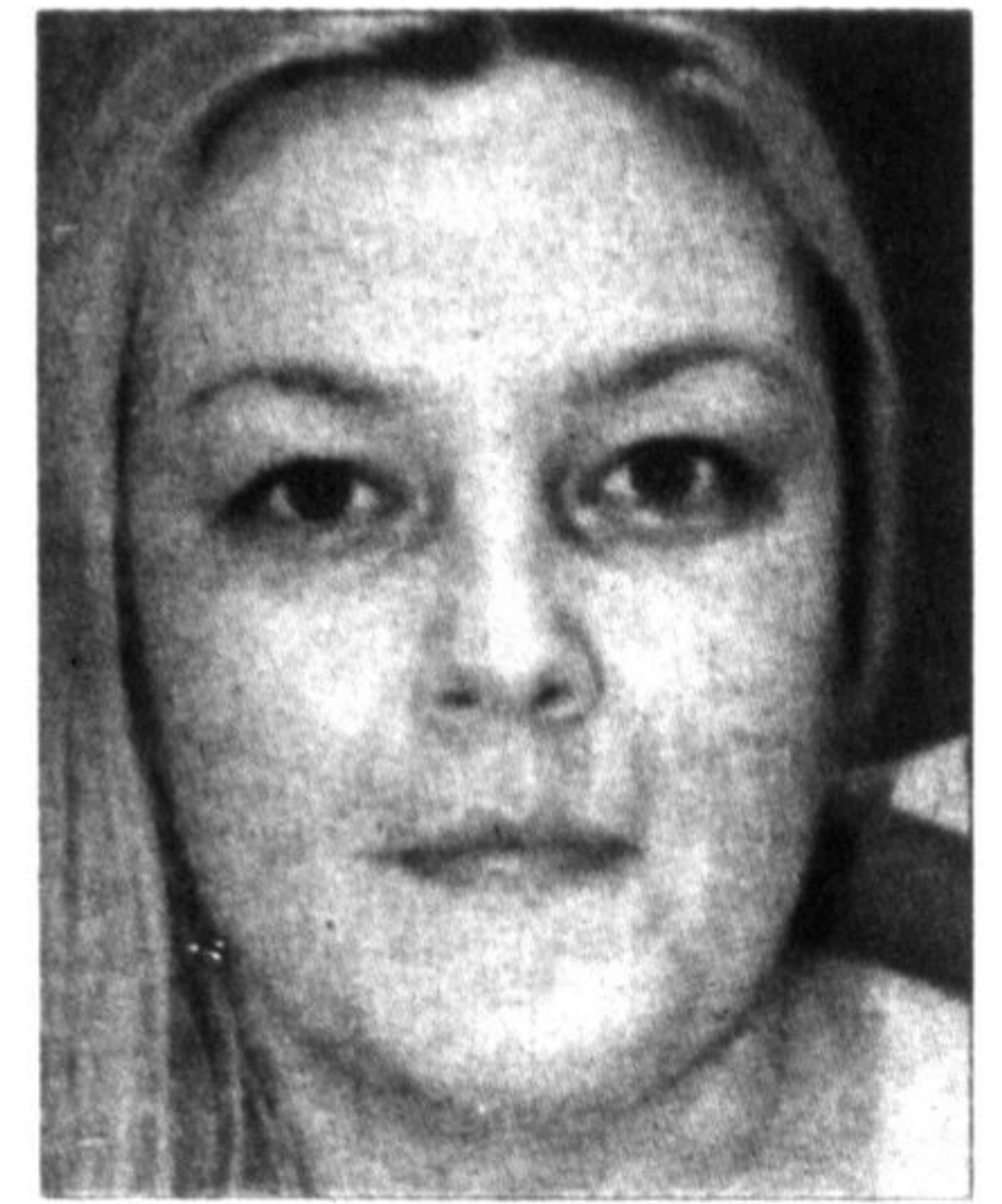
Her two sons now reside with their father, he added.

Loughlin's lawyer, Robert Chartier, said he has to speak to his client before any comment is made.

Because his sentence is more than two years, he will spend his time in federal prison.

A charge of possession of a controlled substance against Loughlin was withdrawn.
