Accused pimp already faced charges

The man charged with pimping out a juvenile last week is already facing aggravated assault charges after an alleged incident involving one of his Stouffville neighbours.

Court records show Stuart Walker was

brought before the courts almost a year ago today after police say he commanded a number of his dogs to attack a nearby resident after a dispute. The man allegedly suffered extensive damage to his head, face and arms after the alleged October 2013 attack.

The revelation comes days after Walker's

home on Hwy. 48 and Bloomington Road was raided by police Oct. 2 around 4:30 a.m.

While searching the home, the force said the 32-year-old resisted arrest, but was eventually taken into custody and charged with a litany of
