## 'Tis season for flu prevention

lu season is upon us. Fortunately, we have preventative measures such as hand washing, sneezing or coughing into your sleeve, and getting the flu shot to help protect us against getting sick.

Ontario flu season typically begins in mid-October and lasts until April. The flu is an acute respiratory illness that can lead to pneumonia. If you or a family member have other health issues, it can pose a serious threat. Those at higher risk of influenzarelated complications include the elderly, young children, pregnant women and people with pre-existing health conditions. The virus spreads mainly from person to person through coughing, sneezing or by touching a surface contaminated with the virus. If you have the flu, you may be contagious to others before your symptoms appear.

Our government is committed to protecting the health of Ontarians by offering the influenza vaccine free of charge to anyone over the age of six months who lives, works, or goes to school in our province.

I encourage everyone who can to get immunized. The free flu vaccine is available at doctors' offices and at community and workplace flu immunization clinics. It is also available for those five years of age and older through trained pharmacists at almost 2,400 pharmacies across Ontario. All you need is your health card.

As the former Medical Officer of Health for York Region for many years, I am con-
