Sarah Prowten was diagnosed with juvenile arthritis when she was two years old.

The Stouffville resident, who is now eight, visits her specialist regularly and takes medications to control her condition. She is also determined to do all she can to help raise funds to find a cure and will be participating in this year's Foresters' BIG Swim for Arthritis, which takes place at the Lebovic Leisure Centre April 20 and 21.

Sarah, along with national event spokeswoman Joanne Malar, a three time Olympian, are joining other Canadians with arthritis in encouraging people to register for the swim. "During the last two years of my involvement with Foresters' BIG Swim, I have met so many amazing and courageous people that are living successful and rewarding lives with arthritis because of the generosity of Canadians across the country," said Ms Malar, who has devoted her post-Olympic career to

promoting healthier living through exercise, holistic nutrition and positive attitudes.

"The thrill for me comes from combining two of my greatest passions, health and swimming, into a cause that I really believe in. Swimming has great benefits for those suffering from arthritis: the warm water allows your muscles to relax and eases joint pain, making it easier for you to continue to exercise. The water can also help to support your weight which can increase the range of motion, while still providing resistance for muscle strength and toning."

Arthritis is not just a disease of the elderly. Juvenile Arthritis is one of the most common chronic conditions in children and it is estimated that one in 1,000 Canadian babies and young people under 16 are affected. Juvenile Arthritis causes physical pain and disability and prevents many children from participating in a wide variety of childhood activities.

The Foresters BIG Swim for Arthritis is a national swimming
