Sunday is our ecumenical church service, the strawberry social, the annual pet contest, possibly a return by Doo Doo the clown.



# May We Suggest Three Unique Alternatives

I suspect that many of the readers have just returned from opening the cottage. Not a good time - cold and wet, but I digress ... and if any activity entailed outside maintenance you were constantly molested by black flies. I feel your itch. Perhaps you are, now that you are home, reticent to work outside on, say a deck - traumatized by those marauding cannibals. If you can overcome your phobia I suggest some wood species for that deck I suggest the following in light of the increased costs of Red Cedar and Ipe:

The first is White Cedar. It will last as long as Red cedar. However, it is a little softer and in most cases limited to 12' long.

The second one is Massaranduba or Brazilian Redwood. It is almost as hard as Ipe and similar in colour. 1 x 6 x 8 - 16' are \$2.75/lin. ft.

The third one is Tigerwood. It is creamy with dark streaks selling for \$2.75/ lin ft. 8' to 20' long.

They will be arriving in 2 weeks. Be the first on your block/town/ county to possess one of these unique woods!
