Lodge members donned the symbolic clothing the meeting a few distinguished members. of that long ago era and travelled by horse and including Right Worshipful Brother Rick

buggy to the location where it all began. although they did not have to travel quite as far as the 1860 members. They just rode over from Ashlane Farm on McCowan Road in an Dr. Don Petrie, a friend of the Lodge original covered Baine wagon.

As in 1860, they held their meeting in the livery stable on the property - although on this occasion they met on the main floor, since the original upper part of the building has long since been rendered unusable. Gerry Mariani, a current Richardson Lodge member. now owns the livery stable and the other remaining building on the property.

After the initial formalities of the June meeting there was a recess, followed by re-adjournment at the current, spruced-up Lodge at the corner of Ninth Line and Second So it was that on June 15, 2010, 12 current Street in Stouffville During this portion of
