When "Doctor" Edward Einstein wants to unwind, he can often be found visiting his good friends Rick and Linda Wigmore at their Musselman's Lake home.

The acclaimed wine guru co-hosted *Vine and Dine* on CHTV and has written an informative and entertaining book, *Ask The Wine Doctor*. He also hosts a weekly radio show on boom 97.3. His columns on the fermented grape have been widely syndicated in Canada and abroad, and his attitude to wine is down to earth and refreshingly lacking in snobbery.

He came by his present occupation in a rather roundabout way. "I had been working on a psychology degree and was playing music on the side," he recalled. "It was a very prolific career which made me some money, and allowed me to see a lot of the world."

He first caught the wine bug when he was looking for a job to help pay for his education. "A buddy of mine said, 'Do you want to come and

work in a liquor store for Christmas?'. His love affair with the grape was just beginning. "My voracious appetite for wine knowledge led me to intensive reading, wine courses, wine tastings and travels to wine regions worldwide," he noted.

"I ended up becoming a senior consultant for the LCBO for about 10 years." When he was ready to take on a new challenge, he began to reflect on the people he'd met in the wine business. "They were happy, they seemed intelligent and educated. They were interested in the finer things in life and they travelled."

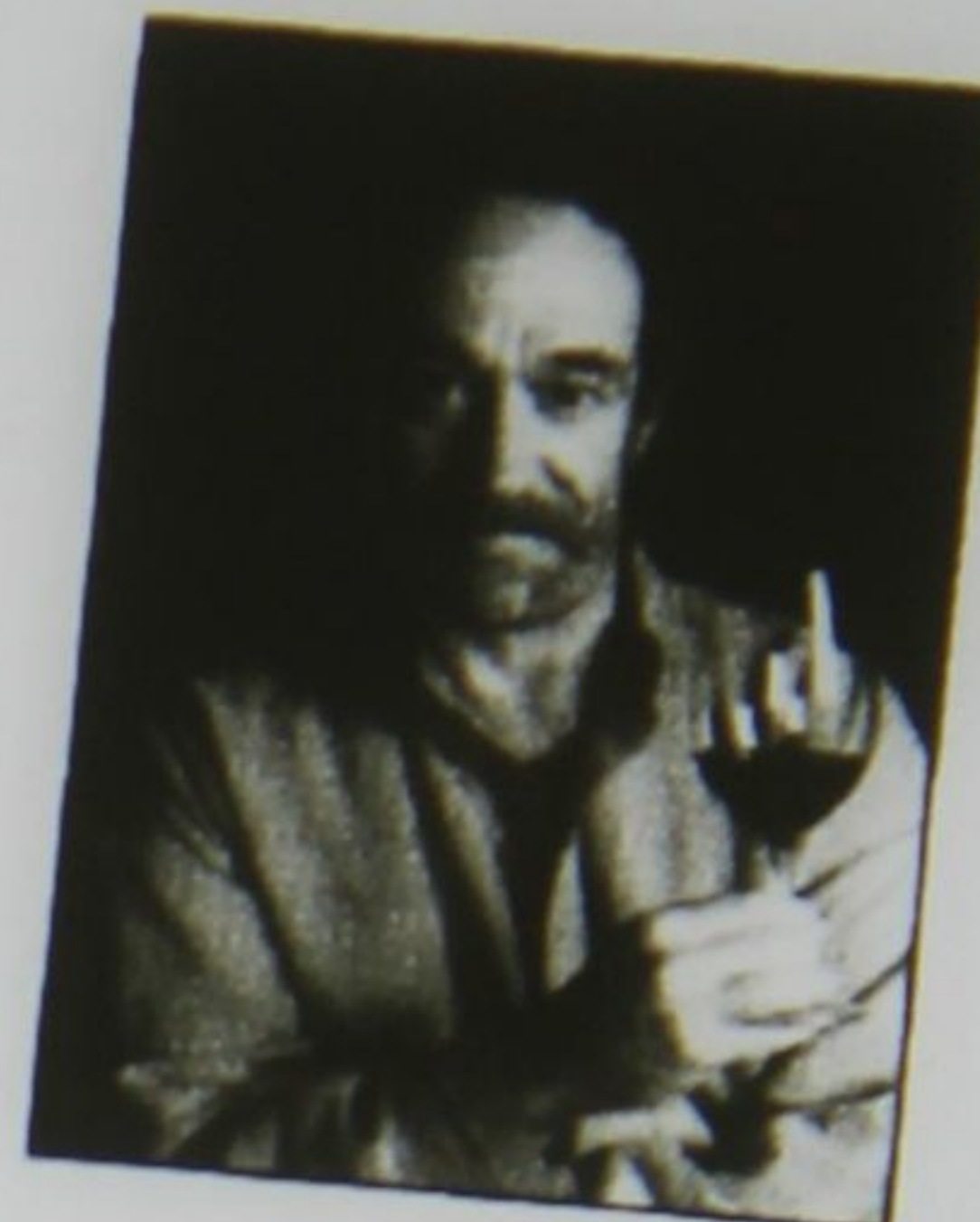
In short, they led the kind of life that held great appeal for Edward himself. He spent about a year putting his business together and hasn't looked back since he launched it 30 years ago. In addition to writing and speaking on wine, he also travels extensively in his role as an international wine judge and gives lectures on wine-related topics.

Not only is good wine a pleasure to drink, said Edward, "but scientific and medical studies

show that it can be part of a healthy lifestyle in moderation. Now some retirement homes are serving a glass in the evening."

Edward met the Wigmore family through their company, the Ravenshoe Group. "They printed calendars for me and ended up doing a lot of photos for my TV show," he said. "We just hit it off and have remained good friends ever since."

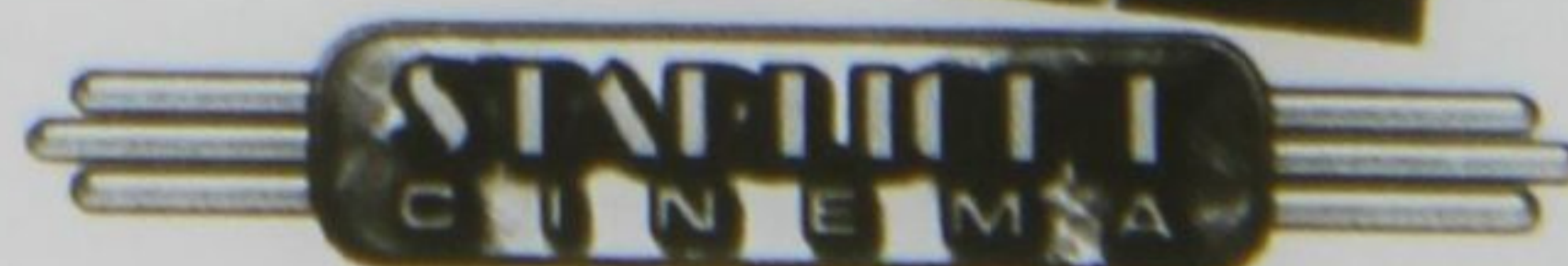
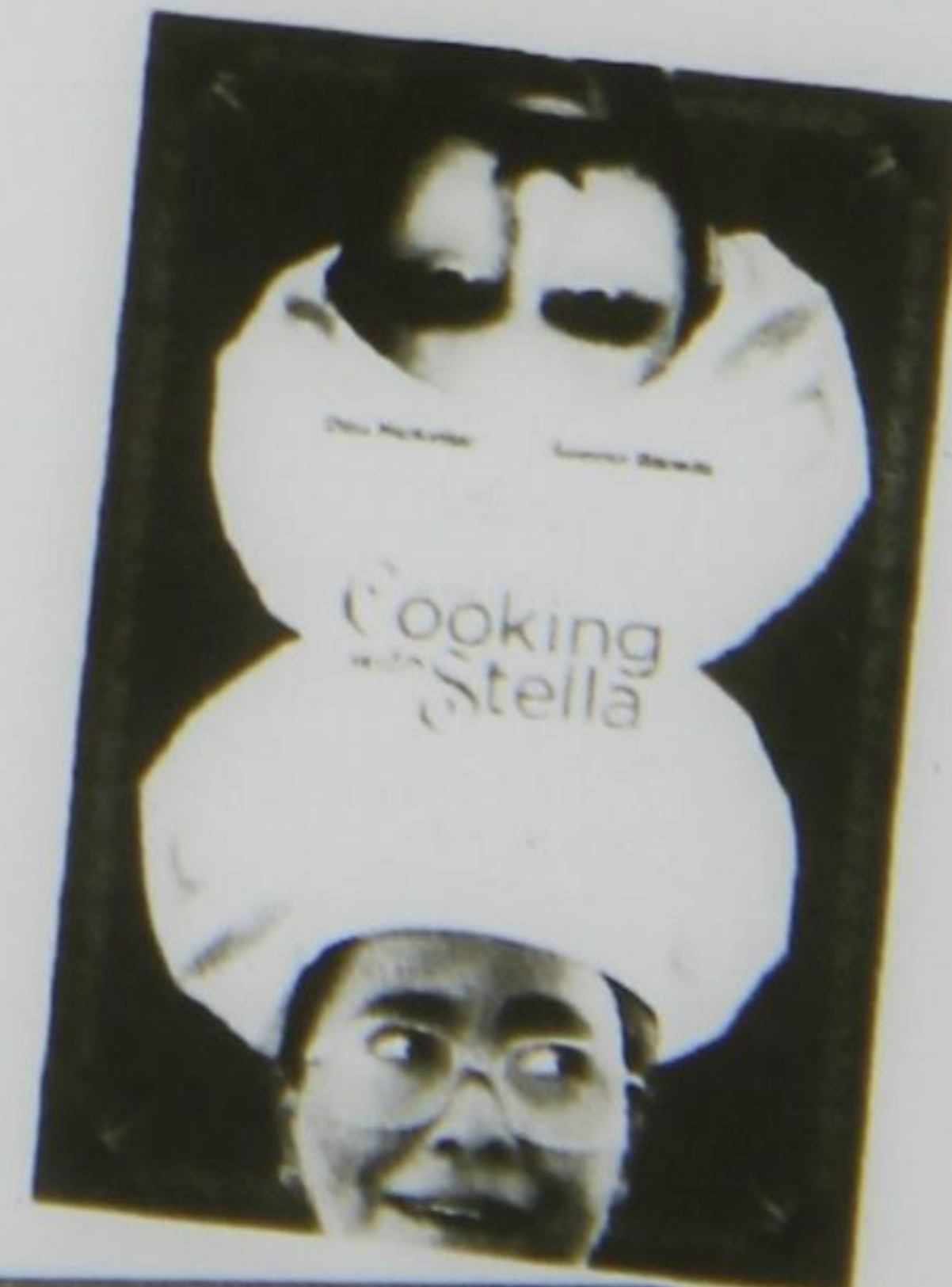

Michael learns many important lessons from his teacher, including glorious traditional South Indian cooking. And Stella? Let's just say dreams sometimes come true in unexpected ways.
