On Nov. 10 at 7 p.m., Starlight Cinema at Nineteen on the Park presents Please Give, Nicole Holofcener's perceptive, often devastatingly funny, take on modern life's contradictions, good intentions and

shaky moral underpinnings.

Kate (Catherine Keener) has a lot on her mind. She wrestles with the ethical problem of buying furniture on the cheap at estate sales and marking it up for her Manhattan store, as well as her desire to discourage her teenage daughter from wanting the expensive things she herself covets. And there's her relationship with her husband, Alex (Oliver Platt), not to mention her free-floating 21st century malaise - the problem of how to live well and be a good person when poverty and homelessness are just outside the door.

Then there are the neighbours: cranky, elderly Andra (Ann Guilbert) and her two granddaughters (Rebecca Hall and Amanda Peet). As Kate and her family interact with them, with each other, and with their New York surroundings, a complex mix of animosity, friendship, deception, guilt and love plays out with both sharp humour and pathos. Please Give, which was an official selection at Sundance and Berlin film festivals, was greeted with almost unanimous critical acclaim.


Starlight's World Cinema Series continues Nov. 24 at 7 p.m. with I Am Love, the story of a wealthy Italian family whose

Eduardo Sr., the family patriarch, has decided to name a successor to the reins of his massive industrial company and surprises everyone by splitting power between his son Tancredi and grandson Edo. However, Edo dreams of opening a restaurant with his friend Antonio, a talented chef.

At the heart of Tancredi's family is his wife, Emma (the luminous Tilda Swinton), a Russian immigrant who has adopted the culture of Milan. An adoring and attentive mother, Emma is shaken to the core when she falls deeply in love with Antonio and pursues a passionate love affair that will change his family forever.
