The Amity Trio comprises violinist Michael Adamson, cellist Alyssa Wright and pianist Olga Lishansky Rutan.

Simcoe's premiere chamber ensemble makes its Nineteen on the Park debut on Nov. 7 at 2 p.m. with a program featuring Beethoven's *Archduke Trio*, Haydn's *Gypsy Trio*, Schubert's *Nocturne* and two of Piazzolla's *Four Seasons of Buenos Aires*. Each musician is an accomplished soloist, and their performance as trio demonstrates a deep affinity for their music, which they interpret with passion and grace.

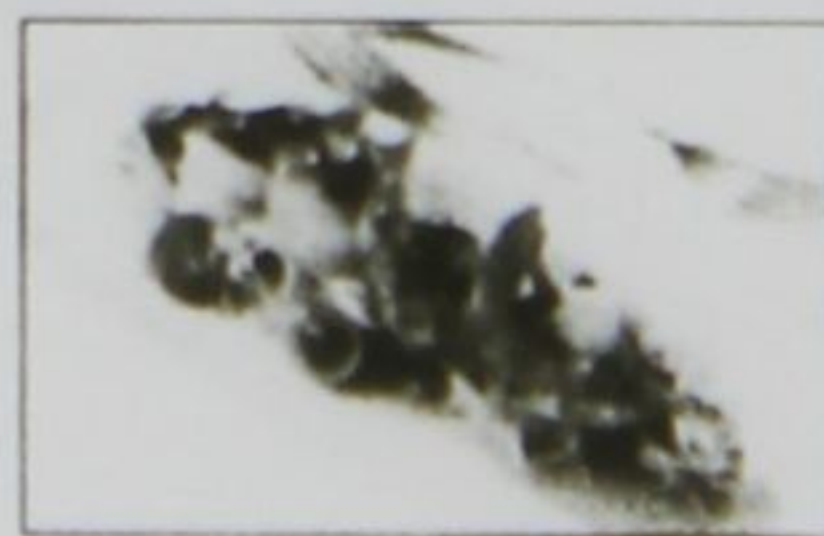
