MARKHAM HIGH SCHOOL.

To the Editor of the TRIBUNE. Sir:—A good deal is said about the expenses of teaching the pupils of Markham High School. It is often said that the village is paying for the education of the county pupils.

1st. The Government by a grant and the expenses of inspection, etc. 2nd. The County, and 3rd. The Village.

The balance of the expenses after the government grants is borne by the county and the village in proportion to the number of pupils that come from the county and the village, respectively.

Now as to the school's present financial condition. The amount levied on Markham village for High School purposes in 1896 was \$600. On the 1st of January 1898 there was in the treasury \$755.09. The levy in 1896 was \$240, yet, notwithstanding this small tax on the village the Board was enabled to pay all ordinary current expenses and to make nearly \$800 worth of permanent, substantial improvements, and they have on hand a balance of about \$700 to start with in 1897.

The fences, as is well known, have been in a dilapidated condition for years. The rails were so rotten that they would not hold the nails and the posts were so far gone that the fence had to be propped up in several places.

Such being the case, and at the same time the village tax for High School purposes being reduced to the very small sum of \$240, we ask the chronic dyspeptic faultfinders what reason you have to complain? What are you grumbling at unless it is that you are jealous and vexed because the school has been ably managed and made a grand success, both in its financial and educational standing.

One word as to the fifth teacher. The large attendance and consequently crowded state of the classes made the engaging of a fifth teacher imperative. The government demanded it and the county had a right to ask that the pupils it is sending here, and for whose education it is paying in full, shall have the best educational advantages. Besides our High School, to be a continued success must be kept abreast of its requirements. We have to day one of the best High Schools in the Province of Ontario, if not the very best, and to keep it in the front rank should be the pride and aim of every citizen, and more particularly so as the greater its success, the less in taxes it will cost us to maintain.

The multiplex printing telegraph invention by Professor Henry A. Rowland, of the John Hopkins University, is about ready for commercial use. By the instrument an operator can transmit a telegram written upon a typewriter and have it reproduced in typewritten form at the receiving end. In addition to the typewritten part of the invention, Dr. Rowland with his new invention, can send over the same wire five or six different messages at the same time in one direction, which, in duplex, makes ten or twelve messages that can be transmitted on the same wire at the same time.
