

the long vacation the celebrated St. George case was adjourned until Sept. 9th, by Justice Rose. The Grand Trunk Railway Company had come to agreements with the several plaintiffs as to the amounts at which they would sattle their claims in the event of the company being declared liable for the accident. The learned judge took his seat in the front court room at Osgoode hall on Tuesday morning, and made morning at 10 o'clock he would deliver his judgment in the jury's answers to the questions put by him at the trial.
