## Col. Lindbergh Says Credit Due Plane, Not Him

Better Than It Was When New, He Declares, At End of 22,350-Mile Tour

New York.—Back at the starting point of his flight to world fame and his 22,350 mile tour of the country, Col. Charles A. Lindbergh was welcomed by 2000 persons, including Harry F. Guggenheim, president of the Guggenheim Fund for the Promotion of Aeronautics, under the auspices of which Colonel Lindbergh made his tour.

The Colonel shifted the conversa tion of interviewers from himself to the merits of the plane that had carried him through 355 hours of flying since he left San Diego, Calif., previous to his hop to Paris. "The Spirit of St. Louis is in fine shape," he asserted. "It gives more revolutions per minute now than when it was new. But this looks like a good time to do it, so I'm going to have it completely overhauled. That's never been done since it was built, you know. No, it isn't destined for a museum yet.
