Jay Reesor knows what it's like to make mistakes.

He also knows that he's been forgiven for a few in his lifetime.

And considering it took place on Thanksgiving, he's willing to forgive and forget the 200 or so people who passersby say trespassed onto his north Markham farm's pumpkin patch to take some snapshots... and some pumpkins.
