## York Region is planning for the future and wants your feedback

The Regional Municipality of York continues to plan for future water and wastewater servicing and is looking for your input. York Region is expected to grow to 1.79 million people and 900,000 jobs by 2041. To accommodate this growth and be at the forefront of best practices, York Region is reviewing and updating its Water and Wastewater Master Plan.

The Water and Wastewater Master Plan ensures water and wastewater systems meet current and future demands and are able to provide safe, cost-efficient and reliable services to the Region's communities.

## Your community, your say.

Since the second round of the public open houses held in June 2015, the Region has completed the evaluation of water and wastewater servicing strategies and alternatives. Study findings, staff analysis and community input have helped us to determine a preliminary recommended water and wastewater servicing solution. These results will be presented to the public for feedback at the third and final round of open houses in January:
