Ian Kelly's been described as "the big guy with that unique voice". His arrangements and lyrics have grown popular throughout his performances. His previous album, Speak Your Mind, went gold in Canada after 40,000 copies were sold, just weeks before his new third album, Diamonds & Plastic.
